TODAY-CEMETERY SUNDAY 2021: As with last summer we endeavour to avoid large gatherings which could spread Covid -19 or its variants. So today, August 15th, Mass will be celebrated for all our deceased loved ones in Ballinamore Church at 1pm. This mass will be available on line and can be accessed by logging onto churchtv.ie and selecting Ballinamore church. Representatives from the 4 church areas will participate in the Liturgy, only those involved in the Liturgy should attend this mass. This afternoon the priests will bless all graves. Holy water will be available in each church and at Oughteragh cemetery, so individuals may bless family graves also. CONFIRMATION: Bishop Martin has written to the priests of the Diocese to say that the sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation may now take place. However we must ensure that every precaution is taken to prevent the spread of CoVid19 and its variants. The revised dates for Confirmation will be available during the Week. First Communion has been set for 18th/19th September. Thank you for your continued patience and understanding.

REFLECTION

Mary was someone who knew death close at hand

She turned to God for help as all of us do in bereavement, when her husband died. She knew the death of mother and father, and the support of cousins and relations at a time of mourning.
