#### Cemetery Sunday 2020:

The annual visitation and blessing of Graves is cancelled this year due to Covid 19 restrictions. On Sunday **August the 16th** a mass for all our deceased loved ones of the parish will be celebrated in <u>Ballinamore</u> <u>Church at 12.30 pm via the Webcam only</u>. This mass will be available online and can be accessed through Churchtv.ie. Representatives from the 4 church areas are invited to participative in the Liturgy. **Only those involved in the Liturgy will be permitted to attend this mass. The graves will be blessed privately by the priests.** While the graves will be blessed privately by the priests small bottles of water will be available at each church for family members to bless their own graves if they wish after the special mass on August 16th.

**Covid 19:** As the obligation of the Sunday mass is supended, if you are available to attend weekday masses please do so, especially the 11am mass on Saturday morning in Ballinamore as this will leave more places available for the Sunday masses. While there is every reason to be grateful for the relaxing of some of the COVID 19 restrictions, there is still a great need for each of us to be vigilant and not to neglect to play our part in containing the spread of this dreadful virus. While we are delighted to be able to worship in our local church again, please follow the present day guidelines, especially in regard to social distancing and co-operate with the Ushers who are there to assist you. *Please wear face masks while you are in church as advised by HSE Stay Safe Guidelines.* While we are sorted out for ushers & sanitisers team for the month of August in all churches, it is important that we don't leave this task to the usual suspects. #### **Ballinamore Church Closure**

**Proposed Stained Glass Windows for Ballinamore:** a crucifixion scene of three stained glass windows has been offered to the parish as a gift from the Sisters of Charity. These were originally placed in a Convent Church in Cork. While we appreciate this generous gift, the windows need to be restored which would cost €10,000 each. These are valueable windows and would greatly enhance the sanctuary in Ballinamore Church. If you or your family would like to donate towards the cost of a window please contact Fr. Sean. A plaque bearing the names of Donors or those in whose memory donations are made will be placed in an appropriate place in the church. We hope to have the stained glass windows installed by the middle of August. For this to happen preparatory work has commencedand will continue for another week. For Health and Safety reasons the church will remain closed until the work is completed with the exception of mass on Saturday & Sunday at 11am. All **Ballinamore weekday masses will be celebrated in St. Mary's Church Aughnasheelin until the work is completed which will take about 2 weeks.** While we are sorry for the inconvenience we ask for your cooperation.

#### Community Hall-Island Theatre.

We will shortly be opening the doors to the newly renovated and extended Ballinamore Community Hall & Island Theatre. The cost of the redevelopment works was  $\in$ 600k which has been funded by Grant Aid of  $\in$ 300k, borrowings of  $\in$ 210k and fundraising of  $\in$ 90k. We would like to thank you for your support in 2019 and ask that you continue that support this year to help us finance the loan repayments.
